### FNESC Anti-Racism Workshop Protocols

The Anti-Racism Toolkit Workshop was developed by the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) as a vehicle to create non-discriminatory and positive learning environments that will enhance school success for Aboriginal students. The overall goal of the workshop and toolkit is to see that educators, community members and students gain a better understanding of the impact of racism in education and learn about the measures that can be taken to combat racism and mitigate its effect. The following protocols are established to ensure that people are trained to use the toolkit effectively, that the anti-racism workshops are presented where there is a demonstrated need and in such a way as to have fair regional representation across the province and that there be an equitable cost sharing arrangement between FNESC and those organizations requesting the workshop and toolkit.

**Please note, only those groups or organizations requesting a workshop will receive an Anti-Racism Toolkit.**
