Founded upon the First Peoples Principles of Learning, English First Peoples courses for Grades 10-12 offer students of all backgrounds the opportunity to explore First Peoples' worldviews through written oral, visual and digital texts. English First Peoples (EFP) 12 is the academic equivalent to English Studies 12 for BC Dogwood Graduation Diploma and for post-secondary entrance requirements.

The *FNESC/FNSA EFP 10-12 Teacher Resource Guide* was revised in 2018 to reflect the latest BC curriculum and incorporate recently-published First Peoples texts. At this workshop, participants will learn about the scope of the guide, discuss its use, and participate in small group break-out sessions.
