<b>Hosting a family language and culture or on-the-land learning activity</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We would like to organize on-the-land learning activity for parents and children on our traditional territory to fish, learn about hunting and trapping, traditional medicines and cooking methods that are used in our culture.</li> <li>Bring our elders into our school during language and cultural activities, practicing frequently used words and phrases, using flashcards to foster language learning and encouraging families to use language in daily conversations.</li> </ul>			<input type="checkbox"/>
